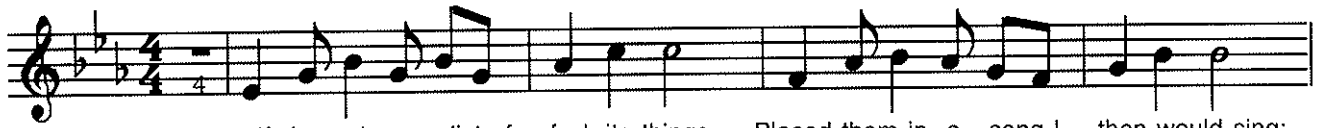


Favorite Things (Four)

I like num-bers and a whole lot more, But my fav'-rite is four!



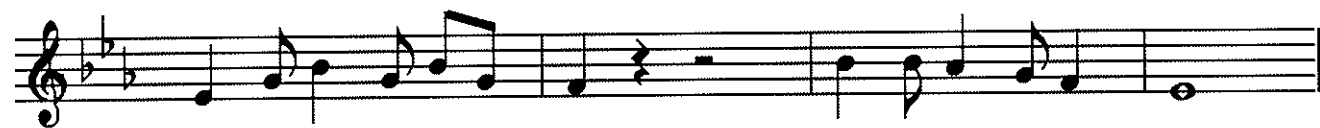
When I go to eat my lunch, four's my num-ber code. You can choose from four directions at a cross-roads.
