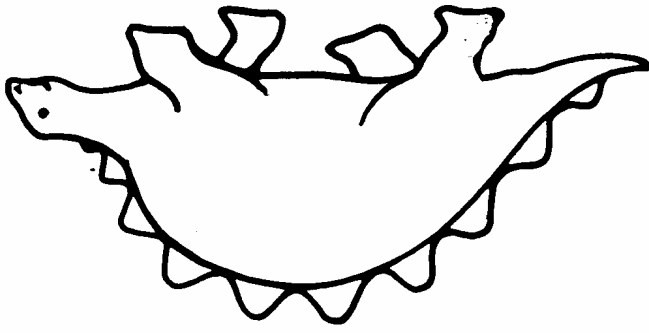

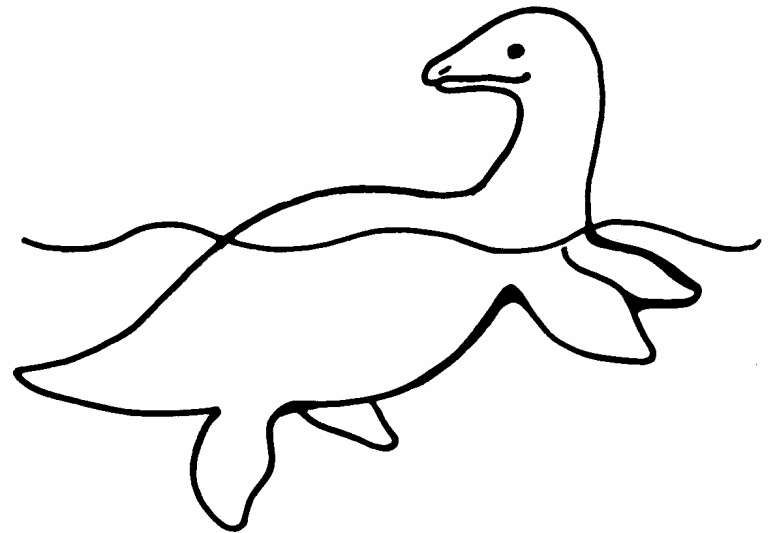
A dinosaur is sleeping.



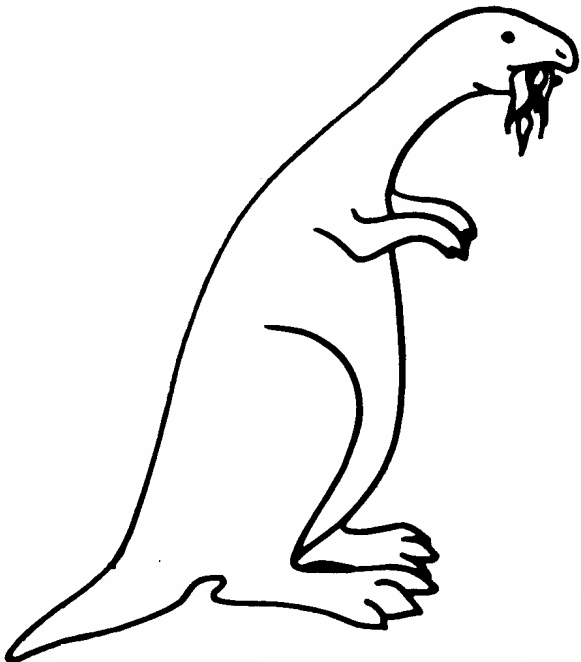
A dinosaur is walking.

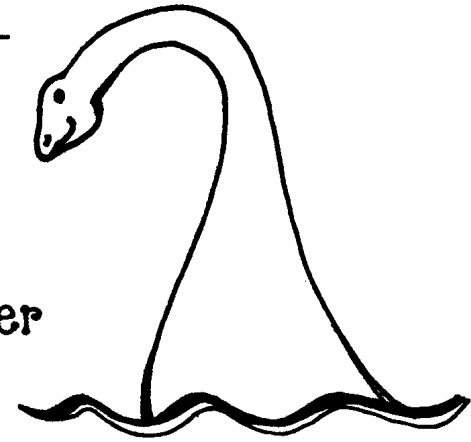
A dinosaur is swimming.

My Favorite Character

Recipe: Digging for Dinosaurs

* This serves 20 paleontologists

Ingredients:

- 1 box of graham crackers
- 1 pkg. of Oreo cookies
- 2 eight-packs of banana or vanilla pudding
- 2 eight-packs of chocolate pudding
- 1 large jar of peanuts
- 1 bag of shredded coconut
- 1 bottle of green food coloring
- 1 dinosaur to hide (A small plastic dinosaur is best, but you can use gummy or cookie dinosaurs with very young children.)

1. Tint the coconut green using a small amount of food coloring and a plastic Ziploc bag. (set aside)
2. Crush graham crackers and Oreos separately..
3. Begin layering as pictured, although the order is not important.
