### Skill/Objective: Dates on a Calendar

#### Directions:

1. Get a monthly calendar and a It's A Date! question sheet.
2. Write the calendar's MONTH at the top of your answer sheet.
3. Read each question on your sheet and look at your calendar to find the answer.
4. Write your answers on your answer sheet.
5. When you are finished, trade calendars with a friend and check their answers by looking at their monthly calendar.
6. \*BONUS: When everyone has finished this activity, see if you can place the calendar months in the correct order.
