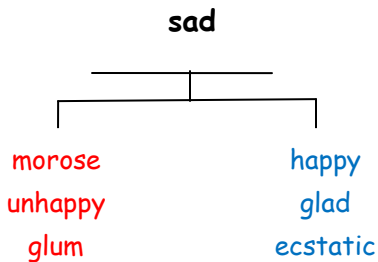
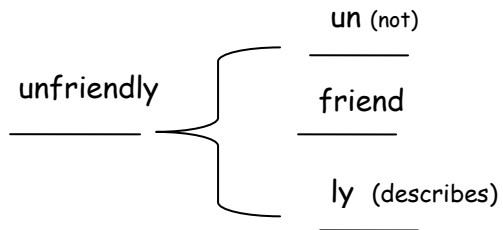

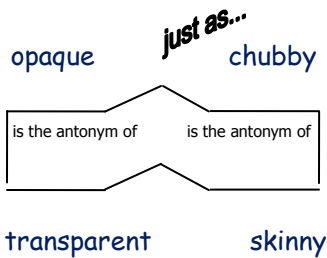
Create a color-coded **Tree Map** to show synonyms and antonyms of a vocabulary word from your reading.



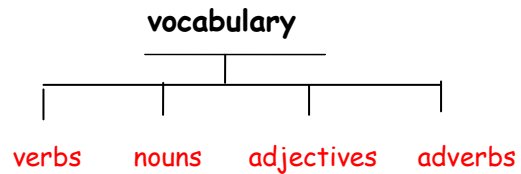
Create a **Brace Map** to break apart a vocabulary word by its word structure (different parts). Write what each word part means in parentheses.



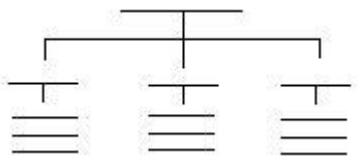
Create a **Bridge Map** to show examples of *at least 2* antonym or synonym relationships using vocabulary words from the text.



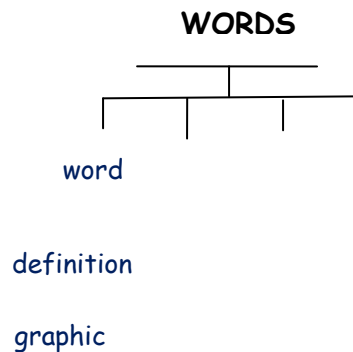
Sort your vocabulary words by parts of speech by using a **Tree Map**.



Categorize your spelling words by sound/spelling patterns by creating a **Tree Map**. Underline the sound/spelling pattern in each word.

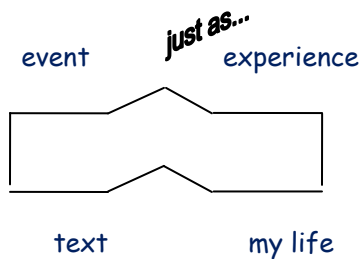

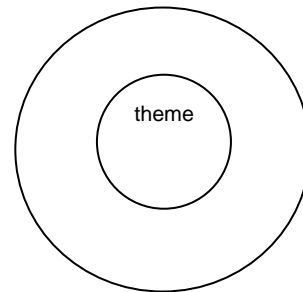


Interacting with Text

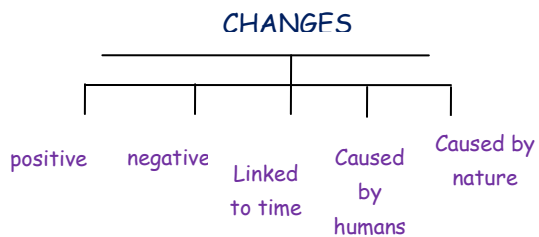
Use a **Bridge Map** to show a text-to-self, text-to-text, or text-to-world connection you were able to make with the text.



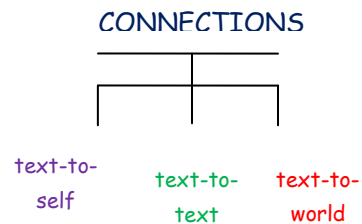
Create a **Circle Map** with the theme of the text in the middle. In the outer circle, write new concepts and ideas that you learned about the theme from reading the text.



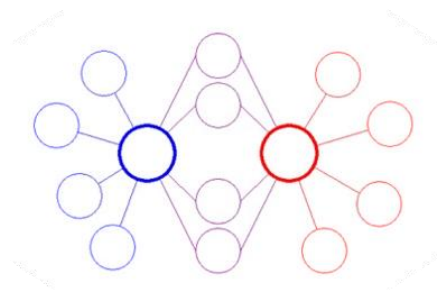
Make a **Tree Map** to categorize and classify the different types of changes found in the selection:
