

# Activity: My Coin Book

## Skill/Objective: Identify and Count Coins

### Directions:

1. You will need:
  - both “**My Coin Book**” papers and a construction paper cover.
  - the penny, nickel, dime, and quarter stamps to share with your group
  - ink stamp
3. Cut the papers apart and staple them into a booklet cover. Label your cover with title and your name.
4. Read the bottom of each page, and stamp pages 1,2,3 and 4 with several coins. Make sure the coins do not stamp over top of each other. You want to be able to see each coin.
5. Now count and write how many coins you have on each page.
6. Then on pages 5,6 and 7 stamp 5 coins on each page and count to fill in the blanks at the bottom. Page 8 is a BONUS page. Do your best!

**If you are not sure which coins to stamp, ask a friend in your group for help before you stamp them, because mistakes cannot be fixed.**

### Materials –

- Copies of **My Coin Book** – both pages
- 6” X 9” construction paper, folded in half for covers (books will be stapled at the top)
- Coin stamps and ink pad (or coin stickers or pictures of coins to cut and paste)
- Stapler
- Pencil
